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	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Other growth requests MHSA funding, navigators and mobile teams are all paired with ADS screening and assessment services. ○ Senate Bill 82 grant will provide for navigators in the field working with transitional age youth. ○ Sacramento County Board of Supervisors voted to not renew the ICE Detainees contract at Rio Consumnes Correctional Center (RCCC). ○ Hearts for Kids program was fully funded. ○ MHSA Prevention and Early Intervention funding to support mobile services, warm line services, use of peers, youth and family advocates, mental health and substance use screenings, strategic coordination of care and cross system training.
