Call to Order Welcome and Introductions	Chair Jennifer Churchill called the meeting to order at 5:30 pm.

Presentation: Behavioral Health Continuum of Care	Dr. Ryan Quist, Director, Behavioral Health Services provided a presentation on the Behavioral Health Continuum of Care, which included Alcohol and Drug prevention and treatment and Mental Health Services. Dr. Quist also provided an overview of the Drug Medi-Cal Technical Assistance Sessions that were conducted on November 7, 2019. Two sessions were held, which provided

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	technical assistance regarding residential and outpatient/intensive outpatient services.
Request for Action Item	<p>A request to have an action item placed on the December 2019 agenda was made as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Criminal Justice Ad-hoc Committee is requesting to be converted to a recognized Sub-committee of the Alcohol and Drug Advisory Board. In alignment with Article IX, Section A of the Alcohol and Drug Advisory Board Bylaws, the above action item will placed on the December agenda for the Board's consideration.

Agency Announcements	<p>Brandi Curry, Probation Department</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Sacramento County Probation Department has renamed the Adult Drug Court program to Recovery Court. The Adult Day Reporting Center is now called Recovery Treatment Center. Graduations are the last Mondays of the month. The Probation Department is re-applying for the California Health Facilities Funding Authority (CHFFA) Grant. This grant would allow the collaboration of services for criminal justice population to access "one stop shop" services being proposed for a G Street location. The Probation Department is the collaborative lead in writing the grant, which is due November 21, 2019.
Provider Announcements	<p>John Durbin, Bridges Professional Treatment Services</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Los Angeles County visited the Family Treatment Drug Court and Early Intervention Family Drug Court. Los Angeles County is planning to model a drug court after the Sacramento County model(s). The PC1000 Drug Diversion Program has been modified to more closely meet the needs of the current population of participants. Outpatient services are now reimbursable by Drug Medi-Cal. Sacramento County Driving Under the Influence (DUI) service providers are preparing for a fee increase proposal, as the last fee increase was in 2012. The STARS (Specialized Treatment Recovery Services) program is recruiting 3 recovery specialists (2 females and 1 male). The DUI/MAT (medicated assisted treatment) services grant pilot program is increasing service capacity.
Behavioral Health Services (BHS) Report Ryan Quist, Director	<p>Dr. Quist provided the following report:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The CalAIM Plan proposal was released on October 28, Proposed changes include documentation requirements Behavioral Health Services Integration (Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services).

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<p>Alcohol and Drug Services (ADS) Report Ed Dziuk, Program Manager</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ During the discussion of integration, there was concern from members of the Board regarding the possibility of the Alcohol and Drug Advisory Board and the Mental Health Board being merged. Dr. Quist addressed these concerns stating that this is not the plan and that he would strongly reject any attempts to merge the Boards at this time. ● The proposal can be accessed at: https://www.dhcs.ca.gov/calaim ● Town Hall report to be sent out to advisory board attendees https://dhs.saccounty.net/BHS/Documents/Reports--Workplans/RT-BHS-2019-Behavioral-Health-Town-Hall-Summary-Report.pdf#search=town%20hall ● Behavioral Health Services is in conversations with the Department of Health Care Services and researching the possibilities of increasing Drug Medi-Cal provider rates prior to July 2020. ● The Board of Supervisors approved two new contracted service programs; Turning Point Haven 500 capacity and Telecare Arise 200 capacity. <p>Ed Dziuk, ADS Program Manager, provided the following report:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● CalOMS has been decommissioned and providers will be inputting the treatment data points collected into AVATAR to be submitted to the state. ● Provider billing information exchange is in a pilot test phase with C.O.R.E. and AVATAR. ● Initial discussions have begun for implementation of the AVATAR clinical workstation being made available for ADS providers. ADS will provide update as more information becomes available. ● On December 18 and 19, 2019, DHCS will conduct a compliance review of Sacramento County ADS. ● The next Methamphetamine Coalition meeting will be held on December 5, 2019 at 7001-A East Parkway, Conference Room 1 from 2-4pm. This month's focus will be the impact of methamphetamine use on the criminal justice system.
