Had a presentation from CAADE (California Association for Drug/Alcohol Educators). The committee still had some follow-up questions after the presentation, which the committee will be looking into. Pete Nielson, President & Chief Executive Officer, California Consortium of Addiction Programs and Professionals (CCAPP) will be presenting a PowerPoint at the next meeting. <p>Behavioral Health Services (BHS) Report Dr. Ryan Quist, Director, Behavioral Health Services</p>	<p>Dr. Quist provided the following BHS report:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Covid-19 rates are going down. We're still at a higher rate than we were when we had our nice low back in June. We are continuing to recommend vaccinations. If you haven't gotten vaccinated, please consider doing so. • Also we're moving into Flu Season; please get a flu shot. • With the October 1 mandate deadline for direct service staff to get vaccinated, we are facing workforce issues. We were experiencing major workforce issues prior to this mandate, but now we are really struggling to provide the services that are needed here in our community. • BHS continues to work on the Wellness Crisis Call Center and Response Team program, which was formerly known as

	<p>Alternatives to 911. We are incorporating community feedback as we develop a program implementation plan.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • BHS continues to collaborate with the Department of Human Assistance on an encampment team, which is a proactive approach to reduce the number of people living unsheltered in the unincorporated areas of the County. Our team consists of a mental health counselor, a housing navigator, and peers with lived experience, who are able to help do outreach and engagement with individuals who are living in the encampments and try to link them with services that they can benefit from. • There has been an influx of Afghan men, women, and children, who are resettling here in Sacramento County. We are collaborating with the State and our system partners here in the County in terms of providing support for those individuals as they come into our community. • CalAIM Enhanced Care Management (ECM): BHS continues to work with our local managed care plans (MCP) and we've submitted an application to each managed care plan to help facilitate the provision of ECM services effective January 1, 2022. Extra funding will be added to our provider contracts to support positions that will be responsible for providing ECM services, which will help coordinate MCP Members' physical health care and mental health and substance use disorder treatment needs. • There was an initiative, the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors issued a grant opportunity for \$1 million from the transient occupancy tax. The deadline was October 11, 2021 so we're hoping that a number of our behavioral health providers also were able to get in some proposals. • Advisory Board members requested a CalAIM ECM presentation, which Dr. Quist agreed to do at the November meeting.

<p>Substance Use Prevention and Treatment Services (SUPT) Report Lori Miller, SUPT Division Manager</p>	<p>Lori Miller provided the following SUPT report:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Opioid Coalition on October 18, 2021 will focus on Fentanyl. • Fentanyl awareness campaign collaboration with District Attorney will be rolling out over the next couple of years, and we have just started the planning and development of some of the components of that campaign. On November 6, 2021 the Fentanyl Awareness Safety Fair will take place at the north lawn of the State Capitol from 11am to 2 pm. • National Prescription Drug Take Back Day is October 23. Disposal sites are located throughout Sacramento County. • Uptown Studios has assisted SUPT in kicking off the Bus Shelter Ad Campaign. • SAMHSA (Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration) launched a new Office of Recovery in late September to advance the agency's commitment to, and support of, recovery for all Americans. • Contingency Management was discussed.
