Welcomes/Roll Call	Chair, Melinda Avey, called the meeting to order at 5:31 pm.
Agenda and Approval of Minutes	The November 2021 agenda was approved. The October 2021 minutes were approved as written.
Presentation	Dr. Ryan Quist gave a CalAIM (California Advancing and Innovating Medi-Cal). CalAIM is a multiyear plan to transform California's Medi- Cal program and to make it integrate more seamlessly with other social services. Led by California's Department of Health Care Services, the goal of CalAIM is to improve outcomes for the millions of Californians covered by Medi-Cal, especially those with the most complex needs. The first reforms will start to be implemented in January 2022, which includes the implementation of Enhanced Care



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	Management services. Additional reforms will be phased in through 2027.

The Treatment Committee has decided to assemble a comparison flyer/ brochure of the licensing/certifying agencies for counselors to review and make educated decisions which agency to use.

Behavioral Health Services (BHS) Report Dr. Ryan Quist, Director, Behavioral Health Services	 Dr. Quist provided the following BHS report: Positive COVID cases chart was presented and discussed. The Wellness Crisis Call Center and Response as well as the Assisted Outpatient Treatment programs are moving forward. The Mental Health Services Act (MHSA) Steering Committee voted to increase rates by 10% for MHSA contracted providers.
Substance Use Prevention and Treatment Services (SUPT) Report Lori Miller, SUPT Division Manager	 Lori Miller provided the following SUPT report: A lot of positive feedback was received regarding the November 4 Methamphetamine Coalition Meeting and the personal story shared by Carlos Simpson. WellSpace Health is expanding their methamphetamine continuum of care to include contingency management as well as medication assisted treatment through a methamphetamine residential treatment facility, which will be opening hopefully in July 2022. There will be an increased focus on raising Fentanyl awareness throughout our community as we move into the new year. Planning discussions are underway for possibly holding a Fentanyl Summit in 2022.
