| Behavioral Health Services (BHS) Report Ryan Quist, Director | SB 43 became effective on January 1, 2025. Care Court began serving clients on December 1, 2024. In the past month, there has been 10 referrals resulting in 5 formal petitions. | | | |

| Substance Use Prevention and Treatment Services (SUPT) Report Lori Miller, Division Manager | Lori Miller, SUPT Division Manager, provided the following updates: Behavioral Health Services-Screening and Coordination (BHS-SAC) began January 1, 2025. In 2024, there was a 50% reduction in fentanyl-related deaths in Sacramento County. January 13, 2025, will be the next Opioid Coalition meeting. Kimberly Grimes, SUPT Health Program Manager, provided the following updates: Paradise Oaks has submitted a renewed certification application to the Department of Health Care Services to provide residential treatment to Sacramento County youth. The Collaborative Courts team is now fully staffed. Substance Use Disorder Education Groups are ongoing. There has been a huge reduction in the number of clients active on the Jail Placement Pool. A Bridge Housing contract has been approved for Bridges, Inc. Pamela Hawkins, SUPT Health Program Manager, provided the following updates: | | | |



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| | Our next Healthy Beginnings training will be held on January 15, 2025. Please make sure and pre-register if you have not done so. There is now \$1.5 million flexible funding for housing related expenses for SUPT clients. More information to follow. A perinatal letter of interest (LOI) was issued. Due to a lack of response, it will be re-issued in January 2025. SUPT is actively exploring additional residential treatment providers. SUPT staff are providing screenings at 8 of the 11 mental health CORE sites in Sacramento County. To date, there has been 73 interactions and 10 screenings completed. |
