I. Welcome and Introductions	Chair McIntosh Sako called the meeting to order at 6:01 p.m. A quorum was declared, introductions were made, and the Conduct Agreement was acknowledged.	
	 Chair McIntosh Sako announced that August 2025 will be the final MHB meeting, which will be celebratory and reflective in nature. The first Behavioral Health Commission (BHC) meeting will be September 24, 2025. Applications are still being accepted, and are available on the BHC webpage: https://dhs.saccounty.gov/BHS/Pages/Advisory-Boards-Committees/Behavioral-Health-Commission/BC-Behavioral-Health-Commission.aspx. Ms. Riviera attended a community event and spoke with immigrants who were experiencing PTSD and will be reaching out to the County to help with this process. Ms. Harris affirmed the hard work of Sacramento County mental health professionals, and clarified public comments made at a previous meeting regarding Stop Stigma Sacramento. Mr. Minton affirmed continued support and advocacy for the treatment needs of individuals with serious mental illness incarcerated in Sacramento County jails. 	
II. Public Comment	Public Comment 1: Community member thanked the MHB for having a conversation about mental health diversion, and expressed support for mental health diversion programs in Sacramento County.

III.	Consent Matters: Approval of Minutes	Ms. Avey moved to approve the June General Meeting minutes (Handout #2) and Ms. Walsh seconded the motion. (Mr. Minton, Mr. Gayent, and Ms. Harris abstained. All other members voted Aye.) Motion carried.	
IV.	Division of Behavioral Health Services Director's Report	 Dr. Ryan Quist, Behavioral Health Director, provided a written report on the status of Behavioral Health Services (BHS) (Handout #3). He also provided verbal updates and answered questions as follows: Acknowledged holidays and cultural observances in July, including National Mintority Mental Health, Independence Day, Islamic New Year, Interational Self-Care Day, National Hire a Veteran Day, and National Disability Independence Day. BHS is partnering with the Rivercats and will also be partnering with the Republic coming up soon, to raise awareness of behavioral health through sports. BHS began a new pilot, beginning July 1st, where a clinician will be doing a ride along with Sacramento City Fire Department to respond to Mental Health call. On July 1st, BHS went live with BH-CONNECT, with a submission of BHS's plan and intended programming to DHCS. As of June 23, The Sacramento County's Youth Detention Facility has successfully maintained its National Commission on Correctional Health Care (NCCHC) accreditation, demonstrating its commitment to high-quality health services. The Ripple Effect documentary blog series details the impact of the Fentanyl Crisis on our community. The series is available at safersacramento.com/the-ripple-effect. BHS is exploring trends on pressures and triggers for youth that might affect their behavioral health. Noting surges in risk factors (such as emergency department visits) will help BHS alert the community/providers to help mitigate behavioral health challenges.
