

How It's Going

- Since starting in 2019, YHN has served 973 unduplicated youth
- 100% of TAY engaged in YHN services who expressed an interest in receiving behavioral health services were connected to ongoing behavioral health services
- 1,032 followers on social media
- Strong connections with our homeless provider network allowing YHN to enter information into Homeless Management Information System (HMIS) and link youth to shelters and housing
- Partnerships with Wind Youth Services, Sacramento LGBT Center, Gender Health Center, The Grove, local Colleges, Probation, CPS, Francis House, City of Sacramento, and TAY Case Conferencing










Since starting the program in 2019: Youth are asked if they identify with any of the below groups of people.
