

# Innovation (INN) Subcommittee INN Projects Recommendations

## MHSA Steering Committee June 14, 2023

## **Innovation Project Requirements**

- Must contribute to learning rather than focusing on providing services.
- Time-limited; not more than 5 years. Time frame is based on complexity of the approach and evaluation of the approach.
- Must align with the MHSA General Standards.
- After Board of Supervisors approval, must obtain MHSOAC approval before implementation.
- If successful, County may continue the project services but must transition it to another MHSA funding category or another fund source.

Must support innovative approaches by doing one of the following:

- Introduce a new mental health practices or approaches, including but not limited to, prevention and early intervention.
- Make a change to an existing practice or approach, including, but not limited to adaptation for a new setting or community.
- Introduce a new application to the mental health system of a promising community-driven practice or an approach that has been successful in non-mental health contexts or settings.
- Participates in a housing program designed to stabilize a person's living situation while also providing supportive services on site.

(WIC 5830)

Required to have one of the followings as a primary purpose:

- □ To increase access to underserved groups.
- To increase the quality of services, including better outcomes.
- □ To promote interagency collaboration.
- To increase access to services, including, but not limited to, services provided through permanent supportive housing.


Must come through a Community Planning Process (CPP) and align with the MHSA General Standards:

- Community Collaboration
- Cultural Competence
- Client Driven
- Family Driven
- ► Wellness, Recovery and Resilience Focus
- Integrated Service Experience

May affect any aspect of mental health practice or assess a new or changed application of a promising approach to solving persistent mental health challenges, including but not limited to:

- Admin., governance, & organizational practices, processes, or procedures
- Advocacy (i.e., client and/or family advocacy)
- Education and training for service providers, including nontraditional mental health practitioners
- Outreach, capacity building, and community development
- System development
- Public education efforts
- Research
- Services & interventions, including prevention, early intervention, & treatment
- Permanent supportive housing development

# INN Recommendation #1: Psychiatric Advance Directives (PADs)

Recap:

- Psychiatric Advance Directive
- Standardized template
- Accessible technology
- Solicit legislation to assist in creating a legal and recognizable document in California

### **INN Recommendation #2: allcove™**

Recap:

International integrated care model

Focus population: youth ages 12-25

Core services: peer support, family support, mental health, physical health, substance use, supported education and employment

### **INN Recommendation #3**

### Population of focus:

Unhoused individuals and individuals at risk of becoming unhoused, with an emphasis on African American/Black community members

Primary purpose: To increase access to services

### Innovative approach:

Introduce a new application to the mental health system of a promising community-driven practice or approach that has been successful in non-mental health contexts or settings

### INN Recommendation #3 (cont')

### If we implement and test:

- Partnering and collaborative learning with trusted community sites that have not historically provided behavioral health services, AND
- Develop effective strategies with the community to engage the focused population into behavioral health services, AND
   Co-locate Cultural Brokers to use these strategies to deliver peer support and navigation services to behavioral health services and other needed resources

### INN Recommendation #3 (cont')

### ► Will it lead to the following outcomes:

- Increased access to and engagement and retention in behavioral health services for the focused population
- Establish and respectfully maintain a positive partnership with these trusted community sites with the purpose of engaging in mutual learning opportunities

# Next Steps [if approved by SC]

- BHS to develop the INN Recommendations 1 and 2 Plans
- BHS to develop the INN Recommendation 3 Plan in partnership with the focused population and the community
- BHS to present draft INN Plans to MHSA SC for review and comment
- Post draft INN Plans for 30-day public review and comment period
- Mental Health Board (MHB) facilitates Public Hearing at the end of the 30-day public review and comment period
- INN Plans reviewed by the Board of Supervisors for approval
- INN Plans reviewed by the Mental Health Services Oversight & Accountability Commission (MHSOAC) for approval
