	SB326 will be in the March 2024 voter ballot as Proposition 1 under the name of Behavioral Health Services Act (BHSA). This proposition proposes significant changes to the Mental Health Services Act (MHSA). Both the MHSA reform and the Behavioral Health facilities bond will be combined into this proposition. Planning for Proposition 1 will not take place prior to the election, but if passed, planning recommendations will be brought back to the SC for discussion.

	My understanding is that as of January 1, 2024, all Managed Care Plans will be reduced to only partner with Kaiser. We are still learning from the State what the transition plan is, but Aetna will be reaching out to members in the coming days to start the process of transitioning to a new provider. When will the updated referral and resources be ready? We are working diligently to update the standardized referral, but you can go to each of the care providers' webpages to get the updated individual referral forms. Are there Doula services? It depends on who the Managed Care Plan has contracted with, but it is one of the populations of focus for Enhanced Care Management (ECM). Is there an extension in CalAIM for Foster Care children? I believe all youth populations of focus - including child welfare - went live on July 1, 2023.
