24/7 MOBILE CRISIS RESPONSE





COMMUNITY WELLNESS RESPONSE TEAM (CWRT)

ACCESS POINT	Phone/Text/Chat 988	
SERVICES	988 will provide crisis support to <u>all ages</u> and if an in-person response is needed, they will connect the caller to the response team. No insurance is required.	
	Response team consists of a Counselor and Peer. They provide safety planning, assessment, linkage and voluntary support to the hospital if needed to <u>all ages</u> , regardless of insurance

ACCESS POINT	916-SUPPORT (916-787-7678)
SERVICES	Provide crisis support to youth up to age 26 and their caregivers , specializing in foster youth and former foster youth in Sacramento County. Supports can include coaching, teaching coping skills, family conflict resolution, respite (breaks), providing referrals and resources, advocacy, coordination/linkage, and peer support. MENTAL HEALTH URGENT CARE CLINIC

ACCESS POINT	Visit 2130 Stockton Blvd, Building 300, Sacramento, CA
SERVICES	Provide crisis support to <u>all ages</u> experiencing a behavioral health crisis, regardless of insurance. Services may include assessments, crisis intervention, safety planning, medication support* and linkage to ongoing services.

CRISIS RESIDENTIAL PROGRAMS (CRP)

ACCESS POINT	Referral based
	Available to adults ages 18+ , experiencing a behavioral health crisis. Services are voluntary, short-term and provided up to 30 days in a structured home-like environment.
SERVICES	Interventions are focused on crisis stabilization, symptom reduction, building interpersonal and independent living skills to support successful transition back to the community.
	Total of 60 beds available with <u>Turning Point Community Programs (</u> 45 beds) and <u>Capital Star Community Services (</u> 15 beds)







CRISIS RECEIVING FOR BEHAVIORAL HEALTH (CRBH)

ACCESS POINT	Referral based
	Available to adults ages 18+ , experiencing a behavioral health crisis. Services include monitored care, sobering center, including a bed or chair, water, light snacks, a shower, and a bathroom.
SERVICES	Services offered include counseling, mental health support, case management, and peer support.






COMMUNITY SUPPORT TEAM

SERVICES	Hours of Operation: Monday – Friday, 8am – 5pm Serves Sacramento County residents of <u>all ages</u> experiencing behavioral health distress. Services may include health assessments, interventions, system navigation, and linkage to services. Team consists of Sacramento County-employed Counselors and contracted Peer Specialists

CRISIS TRIAGE & NAVIGATION




CRISIS NAVIGATION PROGRAM

ACCESS POINT	Referral based from hospitals/emergency departments 916-800-4924 or email <u>SacramentoCrisisReferrals@bayareacs.org</u>
SERVICES	Available to <u>all ages</u> 24/7. Provides short-term (up to 60 days) crisis intervention, wellness planning, system navigation and connection to services and resources, such as mental health outpatient, housing navigation, vocational, legal supports, benefit advocacy, substance use treatment.



CRISIS RESPITES






CRISIS CONTINUUM - RESPITES

- Center providing short term reprieve/break from a crisis.
- Each site has its own specialty
- Hours of operation and length of stay will vary (typically under 24 hours)

CO-RESPONSE CRISIS INTERVENTION TEAM UNDER THE FORENSIC CONTINUUM

ACCESS POINT	911
SERVICES	 Hours of Operation: Varies per Law Enforcement Agency Ameliorates crises for Sacramento County residents of <u>all ages</u> experiencing behavioral health distress. Team consists of a law enforcement officer and County Licensed Senior Mental Health Counselor. The program leverages CST for support follow-up, navigation, and linkage services to ongoing services.
