On June 6th, the board members learned about the Opioid Settlement Funding and the potential programs that are taking interest in applying for the funding. Lori Miller, Sacramento County Substance Use Prevention and Treatment Division Manager, advised members to distribute a needs assessment survey for the community. Members assisted in the success of over 300 participants for the survey.



Members also received a presentation from <u>The Source, Sacramento</u> to learn more about their warmline and how their services assist those in crisis, and in connecting people to services. On June 20th, members debriefed personal updates as many members will be resigning due to life transitions.



Members also reviewed and revised content for a new program the BHYAB is assisting other Sacramento boards in the development of. This new program intends to focus on prevention education and engaging youths in advocacy. We look forward to the collaboration of the Mental Health Board, Public Health Advisory Board, county behavioral health departments, and Sacramento County Office of Education.

BHYAB FAQ's:

What is the BHYAB?

The Behavioral Health Youth Advisory Board is a governing body that offers youth perspective on mental health and substance misuse goals and objectives for Sacramento County.

What is the commitment?

Board members, ages 14-24, are expected to participate 6-8 hours a month. Board members are appointed to a two-year term. Associate members, ages 12-26, do not have a time commitment.

Do I need any background experience?

No experience is needed! All we ask is that you are passionate about mental health or substance misuse, and we will teach you along the way.

What would I be doing?

We meet in person twice a month to receive information on behavioral health, and brainstorm what needs to be done to make a difference to current policies and systems. Outside of meetings are event opportunities and professional development training.
