 - Unanticipated Impacts on ICCTM Project Include
 - Racial unrest in 2020
 - Attempted Rollback of “Don’t Ask Don’t Tell” and Same Sex Marriage
 - COVID-19 2020
 - Outcomes Included
 - 106% increase in Asian-American callers to Access Line and an 86.5% increase in calls to request services.
 - 33.8% increase in Access Line callers.
 - 525% increase of callers who identified as a gender other than ‘male’ or ‘female’ and a 765% increase of callers who identified their sexual orientation as something other than “heterosexual”
 - How can the Community get involved?
 - Participate in MHSA Community Program Planning Process
 - Join County Committees
 - Participate in trainings offered
 - Volunteer at community events raising mental health awareness
- CLAS Standards Training for the BHYAB
 - Objectives
