#### Here's How the BHYAB Members Are Selected



The <u>PRO Youth & Families</u> staff is responsible for recruitment, and often assist interested youths in filing their applications.

Then, applicants send their applications to Sacramento County's Board Clerks who distribute them to the proper district office. From there the varying county district offices are required to interview all applicants prior to appointing members to represent their district.

Following interviews, the Supervisors make their appointment recommendations during their formal Board of Supervisor meetings.
