January News

On January 7th, Adrienne Shilton from the California Alliance of Child and Family Services presented on AB 2711, a new bill requiring schools to adopt a public health framework for addressing youth substance use and revising suspension policies to support students rather than penalize them. The board expressed strong interest in collaborating with CACFS's Youth Advisory Board on this initiative. Key action items included approving revised bylaws, which now clarify hybrid attendance policies, officer reapplication limits, and Al's role in meetings. The board also approved a transition outline for working with PRO and Wind Youth during the provider shift and established a "Listening Session" Ad Hoc to oversee upcoming engagement efforts. Members reviewed data for their policy brief and discussed incorporating findings on substance use and juvenile justice, with potential collaboration opportunities ahead.

First, you can apply to the board by downloading and emailing THIS FORM.

Then, applicants send their applications to Sacramento County's Board Clerks at BoardClerk@Saccounty.gov, who distribute them to the proper district office. From there the varying county district offices are required to interview all applicants prior to appointing members to represent their district.

Following interviews, the Supervisors make their appointment recommendations during their formal Board of Supervisor meetings.

Before designing the survey, members were trained in essential topics including the differences between **quantitative** and **qualitative data**, understanding the **target audience**, effective **writing techniques**, varying question **styles**, avoiding **leading** questions, determining optimal survey **length**, and survey **structure**.

This survey aims to learn more about the youth's perspective of **mental** health resources and accessibility, as well as substance use on campuses throughout the county.
