Members have been highly active participants in outside events. Wellness Together Student Mental Health hosted the MIND OUT LOUD Webinar, an all-day event focused on increasing awareness, advocacy, and reducing the stigma associated with mental health.

I am involved in equity projects within the Folsom-Cordova Unified School District, and sit on multiple committees to represent marginalized voices and uplift students of color. Also, I am involved with the restorative justice organization Creative Acts, which seeks to use art as a means of healing for people who are incarcerated. I am also a student equity journalist, and the editor in chief of my school publication.

Youth behavioral health is integral to our wellbeing, and I often see it misunderstood and misrepresented. Having struggled with mental health myself, an very aware of the many resources available for youth, however I have also recognized the areas in which more supports are necessary. Young people, especially Black and Brown youth, often face punitive actions for struggling with their mental health. I envision a future where youth are offered the resources they need especially restorative justice and conflict mitigation practices. I feel empowered when I am working on a project that I am passionate about. Even when we reach setbacks, knowing that there is a community of people behind our organizing is empowering. Also, in a world where handwork is prioritized over one's wellbeing, I feel empowered by taking time to rest and reset.
