I'd like to reiterate that in the context of this Stay at Home order, Behavioral Health services are essential services and should continue. The Sac County BHS team has been reaching out to providers to discuss plans for continuing service delivery while maintaining safety for your employees. Where possible, we are recommending services should be telephonic or by video. Where this isn't possible, please screen individuals for symptoms prior to program entry. Attached are the materials we sent out previously. Quality Management also issued a telehealth information notice.

The arrival of COVID-19 will not stop the need for services in the community and this includes service providers, as well as the administrative support necessary to ensure keep your organizations running.
