Eligibility/Criteria

- Is 18 yrs. of age or older.
- Person is suffering from a mental illness
- Unlikely to survive w/o supervision & condition is substantially deteriorating.
- Person has 2 or more psychiatric hospitalizations in 36 months, Person has 2 or more arrests in the past 36 months OR
- Person has had opportunity to participate in a treatment plan by director of the local mental health department, and person continues to fail to engage.

Who Can refer?

- A person 18 years of age or older who is: the parent, spouse, child (18yrs of age or older) or sibling,
- Director of a treating facility where the individual resides.
- Director of the hospital where the person is hospitalized.
- Treating or supervising mental health provider;
- Probation, parole or peace officer.
- Judge/Court

Goals/Objectives

AOT is an intensive outpatient recovery oriented, strengths based, client centered treatment program.

- AOT will connect referred persons to a high intensity, community based full service partnership program utilizing a "whatever it takes" model of service provision.
- AOT will further client selfdetermination in the most effective level of service intensity and community integration as appropriate.
- AOT will promote and optimize community functioning.
- AOT will reduce emergency room visits, psychiatric hospitalizations, admissions to long term facilities, arrests, incarcerations, and homelessness due to untreated or undertreated mental illness.
