WHY MENTAL HEALTH FIRST AID?

Mental Health First Aid (MHFA) teaches you how to identify, understand and respond to signs of mental health and substance use challenges among adults.

WHO CAN BENEFIT FROM KNOWING MENTAL HEALTH FIRST AID?

- · Caring individuals.
- Caregivers.
- Medical staff.
- Substance Use Counselors.
- Administrative/clerical staff in behavioral health settings
- First responders
- Law Enforcement Officers

WHAT IT COVERS

- Common signs and symptoms of mental health challenges.
- Common signs and symptoms of substance use challenges.
- · How to interact with a person in crisis.
- How to connect a person with help.
- Expanded content on trauma, substance use and selfcare.

Learn how to respond with the Mental Health First Aid Action Plan (ALGEE):

- Assess for risk of suicide or harm.
- **Listen** nonjudgmentally.
- Give reassurance and information.
- Encourage appropriate professional help.
- **Encourage** self-help and other support strategies.
