

INREACH / OUTREACH TO SPECIAL POPULATIONS

HOMELESS

- Healthcare Screening and Navigation – (3) Public Health Nurses that are field based. One at Mercy Clinic Loaves & Fishes
- Mercy Clinic Loaves & Fishes – TB testing for mandatory shelters, health care navigation.
- El Hogar Guest House – Onsite healthcare navigation to individuals presenting with mental health conditions that need healthcare linkage.
- County Initiatives – Currently in process of working with Department of Human Assistance to determine RN deployment in new county initiatives.

CRIMINAL JUSTICE INVOLVED

- Healthcare Screening and Navigation – (2) Registered Nurses are based at the South Area Adult Day Reporting Center (ADRC) along with Probation, Mental Health Clinicians, and Eligibility staff. Many probationers assessed at ADRC also meet the HRSA definition of “homeless.”

REFUGEE

- Comprehensive Assessments & Linkage - Refugee Health Clinic provides a comprehensive health assessment including public health screening, laboratory tests, and immunizations for newly arriving refugees to Sacramento County within 30 days of arrival to the U.S. All families are provided linkage to medical homes for primary care.
- Referral Path - All referrals are coordinated through local resettlement agencies.
- Sacramento receives the largest number of newly arriving refugees on Special Immigration Visas (SIV) in the U.S. These individuals have assisted the U.S. government overseas.

HEALTHY PARTNERS

- Administration of the Healthy Partners Program for individuals meeting criteria. These individuals have no health care coverage.
- Criteria - Sacramento county resident, age 19 or older, low income, have restricted scope Medi-Cal (emergency services), and do not have health care insurance.
- Individuals reside all over the county. Most referrals are from family and friends. Sacramento Covered, La Familia, and Department of Human Assistance also educate potential applicants and provide pre-enrollment assistance.
