2. Presentation and Discussion: Needs and Challenges People Experiencing Homelessness Face in Accessing Care and Improving Health Outcomes – Aide Long, Elica Health Centers; Dr. Phil Summers, Sutter Health; Joleen Lonigan and Angela Drake, UC Davis Health	
The committee reviewed a video on homelessness in Sacramento County. Joe Smith, Advocacy Director at Loaves and Fishes, interviewed those who are homeless, about their healthcare experiences with enrolling in Medi-Cal, getting appointments, seeing doctor, etc. Aide Long, Dr. Phil Summers, Joleen Lonigan, and Angela Drake each presented and discussed needs and challenges that people experiencing homelessness face in accessing care and improving health outcomes. Several priority needs identified included:	11:10 – 12:10 pm

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<ul> <li>better access to primary care;</li> <li>more medical and psychiatric respite and recuperative care access and beds;</li> <li>more board and care access and beds;</li> <li>integrated data systems including electronic health records linked to social service system and hospital data;</li> <li>improved patient navigation and payment for case management services;</li> <li>the provision of all In Lieu of Services;</li> <li>revisions to the referral system and reduced barriers to care, including co-locating services;</li> <li>reduced fragmentation of care and patient shuffling between Managed Care Plans;</li> <li>street medicine and primary care clinics specifically for homelessness, which include drop-in hours and doctors specializing in the population;</li> <li>the ability to more quickly transfer Medi-Cal coverage across counties.</li> </ul>

Emely Arienza, a health plan representative, clarified points around the timeframe for changing primary care providers (PCPs). She noted that members can change their PCP at any time. If a member is assigned to a delegated group, they are receiving payment for that member each month, so the member cannot switch mid-month to a different provider due to the capitation payment rate structure.</li> </ul>	12:45 – 12:55 pm
