1. Welcome and Agenda Review – Kyle Stefano, Committee Chair	3:00 – 3:05 pm
Chair Kyle Stefano convened the meeting at 3:05 p.m.	
2. Member Reappointments – Jenine Spotnitz, Sacramento County Department of Health Services	
Jenine Spotnitz asked how the Committee would like to proceed with member appointments for the five beneficiary seats whose terms will end in February 2023. The Consumer Protection Committee is the nominating body for these seats.	3:05 – 3:15 pm
Commissioner Eddie Kirby stated that he would like to ensure the process is open and transparent, and to issue a call for letters of	

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interest (LOIs). Jenine Spotnitz said she can post the call to the Commission website and announce it at the next meeting.

The Committee can review the LOIs at a future meeting and conduct interviews as appropriate before making its nominations.

Jenine Spotnitz stated that this could be scheduled for early December.

- **3. Discussion: Year 1 Implementation of Strategic Plan** Bobbie Wunsch, Pacific Health Consulting Services and Jenine Spotnitz, Sacramento County Department of Health Services
 - A. Review Focus of Implementation Approach/Plan for Strategic Plan and Areas of Focus for Consumer Protection Committee
 - B. Prioritize which strategies should be done in Year 1 (2023), Year 2 (2024), and Year 3 (2025)
 - C. Review data needed to track implementation strategies

Bobbie Wunsch proposed that the SCHA Chair write to the DHCS director, inviting them to attend the Commission meeting and to explain the transition notification process, as well as SCHA's role in reviewing materials.

Commissioner Darrell Lake recommended including DHA in the meetings regarding this process.

For the newsletter, Commissioner Darrell Lake expressed that it has limited effectiveness and members may not read it; Commissioner Kim Williams agreed that people do not open them – consider video or infographic materials instead. Chair Kyle Stefano suggested adding posters in FQHCs with QR codes.

Vice Chair Dr. John Landefeld said communications to providers may be the best way to reach members; also, providers are seeking more information.

Commissioner Darrell Lake mentioned the importance of urgent care access across several locations: this impacts ED visits. The Consumer Protection Committee can request how many people are treated in urgent care vs. ED.

Commissioner Eddie Kirby requested details on communications to Medi-Cal members; he wants to know how many members this was

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mailed to and what their return mail rate is, including for the County, MCPs, and the State. Bobbie Wunsch stated that the new ruling by CMS outlines that when return mail is received, it can be forwarded to members without requesting consent first. Commissioner Darrell Lake mentioned it might be wise to request that DMHC provide step-by-step instructions for members to submit grievances to the provider or at the clinic level – how many levels of appeal before the grievance is escalated (e.g., clinic/clinic director/medical group/managed care plan, etc.)? Commissioner Eddie Kirby noted that the Consumer Protection Committee had a presentation on this from DMHC before Commissioner Darrell Lake joined. He requested that the materials be shared with Commissioner Darrell Lake. 4. Public Comment – One comment per person, limited to two minutes. 4. Public Stefano called for public comment, and there was none. 5. Next Steps and Adjournment – Kyle Stefano, Committee Chair Chair Kyle Stefano motioned to close. The motion was seconded by Vice-Chair Dr. John Landefeld, and the motion carried. The meeting adjourned at 4:30 p.m.
