

## ADVISORY ON TITLE 17 UPDATES

September 20, 2022

### Situational Update

Title 17 California Code of Regulations section 2500 has been updated and is in effect as of August 2022. The full list of reportable diseases and conditions is attached and can also be found here:

Please see below the diseases and conditions that have been added or revised and those that remain locally reportable.

#### Revisions to Title 17 California Code of Regulations Section 2500:

##### Added:

- Monkeypox and orthopox virus infections, within one working day
- *Candida auris*, colonization or infection, within one working day

##### Revised:


- Change to SARS-CoV-2 reporting timeframe from 8 hours to within one working day
- Replace Carbapenem-resistant Enterobacteriaceae (Carbapenemase-producing) with the more inclusive Carbapenemase-producing organism, colonization or infection

##### Locally Reportable Disease and Conditions:

- Chlamydia, pregnant women and children <13 years old
- Influenza (lab-confirmed) cases of ANY AGE, included those associated with:
  - Intensive care unit (ICU) admission
  - Deaths
