

Health Advisory: Baxter IV Shortage and Expiry Extension November 4, 2024

Situational Update

The ongoing IV solution shortage due to Hurricane Helene's impact on Baxter manufacturing continues to impact California's medical and health system. On October 28, the FDA authorized¹ the extended use dates of some parenteral drug products, up to an additional 12 months of expiry – products now have a 24-month expiry period from the date of manufacture.

Actions Requested of Healthcare Systems and Clinicians

- Refer to the attached document for a full list of Baxter <u>products granted expiry extension</u>, searchable by lot number. *Note*: extensions apply only to products manufactured before September 30, 2024.
- 2. Continue ongoing IV and saline solution supply assessments and voluntary conservation measures. ^{2, 3, 4}
