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Health Advisory: Preventing Perinatal Hepatitis B August 13, 2024

Situational Update

Reporting pregnancy status and estimated date of delivery of persons with a positive hepatitis B (+HBsAg) result is required by California Code¹ and Title 17 and is critical for timely postexposure prophylaxis (PEP) for infants born to hepatitis B-infected pregnant persons².

Actions Requested of Healthcare Systems and Clinicians

- 1. **Test** pregnant patients for hepatitis B surface antigen (HBsAg).
 - a. Re-test HBsAg-negative patient before delivery if they have clinical hepatitis or were at risk of exposure during pregnancy.
 - b. **Test** all HBsAg-positive pregnant persons for HBV DNA (viral load)
- 2. Report pregnancy status and estimated date of delivery of persons +HBsAG to Sacramento County Public Health.
 - a. Submit a Confidential Morbidity Report² (CMR) via the CalREDIE Provider Portal.
 - b. **Remind** appropriate health care personnel of the importance of reporting.
- 3. Vaccinate pregnant persons at risk for hepatitis B infection if they are HBsAg- and are not immune.
- 4. Inform +HBsAg pregnant patients of the importance of postexposure prophylaxis and postvaccination serologic testing for their infants. Breastfeeding is safe after the infant receives HBIG and the hepatitis B vaccine within 12 hours of birth.
