# Respiratory Virus Diseases Health Advisory October 1, 2025

## **Situational Update**

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) expects that the upcoming fall and winter respiratory virus disease season will likely have a similar combined number of peak hospitalizations due to COVID-19, influenza, and respiratory syncytial virus (RSV) compared to last season. The peak week of hospitalizations for influenza will likely be moderate (compared to high severity the prior season) and similar to last season for RSV. For COVID-19, it is expected to be similar or higher than last season, especially if a variant with moderate immune-escape properties emerge in the fall.

The West Coast Health Alliance (WCHA) has provided respiratory virus disease immunization recommendations for the upcoming season.<sup>2</sup> Recent revisions to Senate Bill 144 require health care insurers regulated by the Department of Managed Health Care to cover vaccines recommended by the California Department of Public Health (CDPH).

## **Vaccination and Masking**

Sacramento County Public Health (SCPH) will be implementing the influenza masking mandate for all health care workers (HCWs) in Sacramento County starting November 1, 2025. Masking will be required in patient care areas for HCWs who have a contraindication to or decline vaccination. SCPH also strongly recommends vaccination against COVID-19 and RSV (for those who are eligible).

#### **Actions Requested of Health Care Systems and Clinicians:**

- 1. **Report** COVID-19, influenza, and RSV cases and/or outbreaks according to **Table 1** below.
- 2. <u>Offer</u> the influenza and COVID-19 vaccine to all health care workers, especially those with direct patient contact. Refer to your organization for questions related to exemptions.
- 3. **Encourage** COVID-19, influenza, and RSV vaccination for patients according to WCHA recommendations.<sup>2</sup>
- 4. **Implement** infection control precautions as appropriate.
- 5. <u>Treat</u> with antivirals as early as possible for patients confirmed or suspected to have influenza or COVID-19, especially for hospitalized patients and those at risk of severe complications.
