Agenda and Minutes	January minutes reviewed and approved by the Board
Public Health Officer's Report	<p>Update sent in by Dr. Law</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Starting the demobilization process for the COVID team • We have a new decision tree for schools – sent out • Mask mandate has been rescinded. Masks are now strongly recommended in schools and childcare after March 11th. • The COVID- 10 case rate has continued to go down- the dashboard is being updated once a week now.
MCAH Update	<p>Presented by Leesa Hooks</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The MCAH Program is partnering with Sierra Health Foundation and UCD to conduct a Black Infant & Maternal Health Roundtable. • Currently planning to partner with Behavioral Health to do a Substance Abuse and Treatment training around meth and opioids. • The CPSP program has a planned RoundTable event on March 10th focusing on Children with Special Health Care Needs and how to utilize California Children's Services (CCS). • The Public Health Division is planning on a Community Health Nursing Team that will work with the unhoused and collaborate with the Department of Human Services. A second nursing team will focus on families, children and high risk infants with case coordination. Hiring should start after July 1st.
BeMomAware Campaign	<p>Presented by Dr. Brenna Rizan</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A grant funded project to increase Awareness & Support for maternal mental health. The Sacramento Maternal Mental Health Collaborative received a grant award from PSI for \$10,000 to focus on black and Latina women in Sacramento. March 8th an awareness campaign will begin. • Slides were sent out • Website: BEMomaware
Medical Dental Referral and Navigation (MDRAN) System	<p>Presented by Katie Andrew</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Medical Dental Referral and Navigation (MDRAN) system is currently utilized as a medical- dental referral management system by Sacramento County. • Presentation attached

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NFP Update	<p>Presented by Tosha Ulicni</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Everyone’s case load is currently full – in the process of interviewing a new nurse and then we would be able to be at full capacity of 200 clients. Currently at 177 enrolled clients.• The biannual report is due and the request for County funding application is due soon as well.• Referrals continue to come in, we are getting a lot from CBO’s and medical office. There has been a rise in acuity of referrals with more complex medical conditions. We are seeing more moms with socio economic issues and many refugee moms.• Current trainings have been on NFP updates, new guidance and new assessment forms. The California Maternal Quality Care Collab has held trainings in line with the increase seen in maternal mortality data among Hispanic and black women.• Clients still request some tele health visits. Some mons are still hesitant about having someone in the home and some have tested positive for COVID-19 so telehealth has been a good option.• Tosha shared a nurse success story about a mom that left an abusive relationship, had some PTSD and postpartum depression without much support. She was trying to attend school at Sac State but was not sleeping and on academic probation. She did not want therapy. NFP got her connected to the crisis nursery and she began therapy. She pulled herself out of academic probation and was able to start using the Sac State daycare. She is now getting straight A’s and has not missed an NFP visit.
Policy Update	<p>Presented by Katie Andrew</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• AB 1995- Existing law requires Medi-Cal beneficiaries to make set copayments for specified services, including for nonemergency services received in an emergency department or emergency room. This bill would, as of July 1, 2022, prohibit the department from imposing copayments on recipients of specified services, to the extent allowable by federal law.• AB 58- This bill would require a local educational agency, on or before June 1, 2024, to review and update its policy on pupil suicide prevention, and revise its training materials, to incorporate best practices identified by the department in the department’s model policy. By imposing additional duties on local educational agencies, the bill would impose a state-mandated local program.• AB 552- This bill would authorize the Integrated School-Based Behavioral Health Partnership Program, which the bill would establish, to provide prevention and early intervention for, and access to, behavioral health services for pupils. The bill would authorize a county behavioral health agency and the governing board or governing body of a local educational agency to agree to collaborate on conducting a needs assessment on the need for school-based mental health and substance use disorder services, and implement an integrated school-based behavioral health partnership program

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	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • AB 1130- This bill would establish, within- HCAI, the Office of Health Care Affordability to analyze the health care market for cost trends • SB 871- adding COVID-19 to the list of required childhood immunizations to attend school. • Additional information is attached
Board Member Updates/Announcements	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Information sent in by Julie Gallelo: First 5 Sac is spearheading a Regional Summit for Home Visitors from Sacramento and surrounding counties. We will send out an invite to Stacey to share with MCAH AB members. We really want to get the word out to both home visitors and HV supervisors. The virtual Summit will take place on April 26 and will be dedicated to self care and support for home visitors. This topic is especially important, as a recent Home Visiting Workforce Study funded by F5CA found that: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The well-being of the home visiting workforce is a concern, with one quarter reporting to have depressive symptoms • Since COVID, the home visiting workforce is working almost twice as much as before. • About half of the respondents would like additional mental health support. • Reporting more depressive symptoms and experiencing discrimination in the workplace decreased the likelihood of remaining in their current position.
