Public Health Officer's Report	<p>Presented by Dr. Law</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Sacramento County COVID cases are coming back up and we still follow all the State mandates in place. We now have rapid antigen test widely available and the County will be distributing for use in congregate facilities. All County affiliated test sites use PCR testing. Please see current list on Sacramento county public health website.</li> <li>• Drug resistant Gonococcal infections are currently on the rise. The County Sexual Health Clinic on Broadway is open 3 days a week, W, TH, &amp; F. MCAH Update	<p>Presented by Leesa Hooks</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• We have added a PHN to the Black Infant Health Program to oversee case management and conduct virtual home visits. <p>Maternal Mental Health Collaborative Update</p>	<p>Presented by Jessica Walker &amp; Bob Hickman</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Bob Hickman presented on a maternal mental health survey asking providers about mental health and SDOH-related services in the county.</li><li>• Jessica Walker provided some background information on the Sacramento Maternal Mental Health Collaborative. The Collaborative is made up of Stakeholders interested in increasing and improving awareness, prevention, detection and treatment of maternal mental health conditions in Sacramento County. 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NFP Update	<p>Presented by Tosha Ulicni</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• All 8 PHN positions full. Pending approval for 2 SGF positions; hired 1 new office assistance.</li> <li>• Trainings: 4 new FSI (Family Support Initiative or CalWORK's) PHN's completed NFP trainings, 3 FSI PHN's completed Partners in Parenting Education and 1 nurse currently enrolled, 4 FSI PHN's will be registering for DANCE training. Dance training is a framework to facilitate nurse's work with families on important aspects of the caregiver-child relationship. All nurse's registered for a 6 week series of video visit guidance through NFP. All nurses registering for training focused on implicit bias and reproductive justice that meets the requirements of SB464. All nurses registered for a Nurse Shelter Disaster training through Cal State East Bay</li> <li>• Other trainings include: Health Equity, Opioid Use Disorder in Pregnancy and Neonatal Abstinence Syndrome, Engage Families from Diverse Backgrounds with Developmental Screenings and Child Well Being, Perinatal Mood Disorder, Virtual Developmental Screenings Overview, Infant Feeding During COVID-19, Residual Impact of Historical Structural Inequities.</li> <li>• Funded for 200 clients (250 after SGF PHN's are hired). Currently 117 clients enrolled with 28 on waitlist. Prescreening all NFP referrals to see if they qualify or currently receive CalWORK's. Nurse's continuing to conduct virtual nursing assessments over video visits</li> <li>• Principle source of referrals is Capitol OBGYN and other CPSP providers. Have done outreach with Dignity Health, UC Davis, behavioral and mental health service providers, Medi-Cal GMC's, extended foster care services, faith based organizations, maternity homes, and other community organizations</li> <li>• Signed a Letter of Commitment with WIC</li> </ul>
