Center for Oral Health/Early Smiles Sacramento Update	 Presented by Tiffany Turner Navigation is a unique feature of the program. In 2023 COH provided services at 470 school and community events in Sacramento County, screening over 28,000 children. Increased numbers of repeat encounters and children connected to their dental home via MDRAN. Goals for 2024 include increasing consent return rates by launching electronic consents (available in 8 languages) and marketing with wristbands containing a QR code.

	 Resources available from MMC plans Disparities and Inequities Workgroup Identified several groups with disparities: prenatal and pregnant people, those with disabilities, refugee populations, Black, Indigenous, and people of color, foster children, and older adults Some strategies include education for providers and caregivers. Would like to enlist a representative from Alta Regional, State Council on Developmental Disabilities, and Sacramento Native American Health Center Dental Plan Dental Directors meet regularly and will work to include the Sacramento FQHC Dental Directors—Dr. Lisa Nguyen and Dr. Brittany Vacura. FFS Provider Network Adequacy Subcommittee Dr. Porteus to request an update from DHCS on the number of members moving from DMC to FFS and if members are allowed to transition back when requested. Need more information from DHCS to determine which providers are FFS, DMC, or both? There are some discrepancies in provider active status (14% inaccuracies in the past) Sacramento County is calling providers to ask who accepts FFS A real-time assessment should be performed
