EJ Element – State Requirements

- SB 1000
 - Requires cities and counties with disadvantaged communities to incorporate EJ policies into their general plans
 - Must happen upon the concurrent adoption of two or more elements on or after January 1, 2018

General Plan Basics

- Blueprint for Physical Development
- Purpose is to Guide Land Use Decisions
- Contains 891 Policies and 648 Implementation Measures

EJ Element – Purpose

- To Address:
 - Geographic Inequalities
 - Procedural Inequalities
- Lead to unique or compounded health risks in disadvantaged areas
- Main Feature – Comparison of Disadvantaged Areas with Non-Disadvantaged Areas

EJ Element – Topical Areas

- Reducing Pollution Exposure and Improving Air Quality
- Promoting Public Facilities
- Healthy Food Access
- Safe and Sanitary Homes
- Promoting Physical Activity
- Promoting Civic Engagement
- Prioritizing Improvements and Programs That Address the Needs of Disadvantaged Communities
- Crime Prevention

EJ Element – Two Phases

– Phase 1

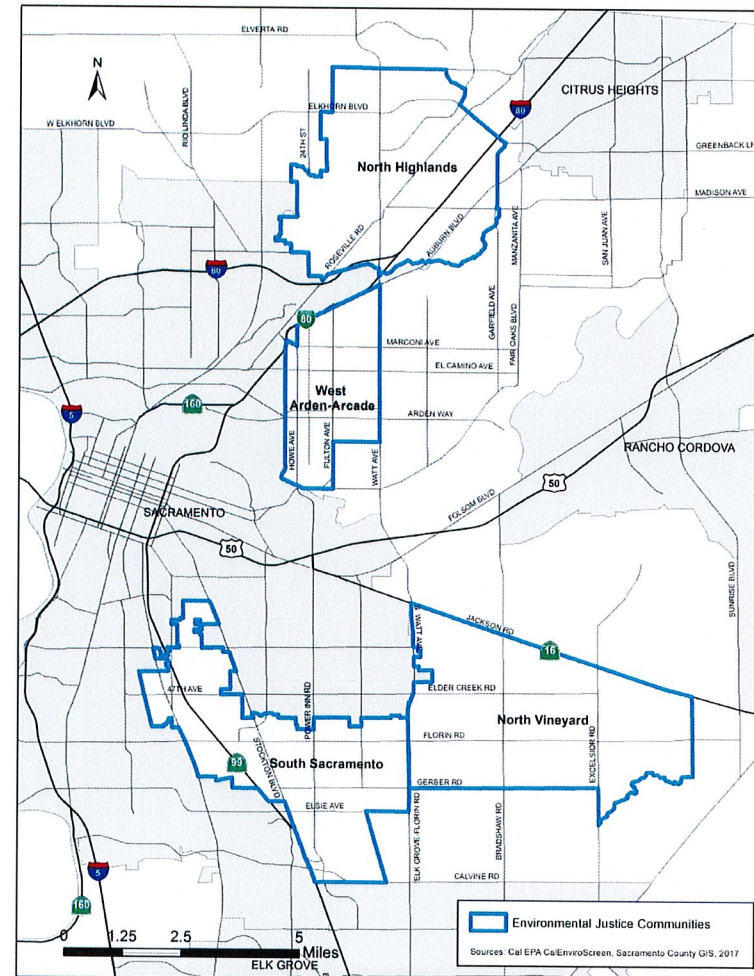
- Approved by Board of Supervisors in May 2018
- Extensive baseline research
- Allows us to meet the minimum requirements of SB 1000

– Phase 2

- Extensive public engagement, additional baseline research
- Policy development
- Goal – Approval by BOS – April or May 2019
