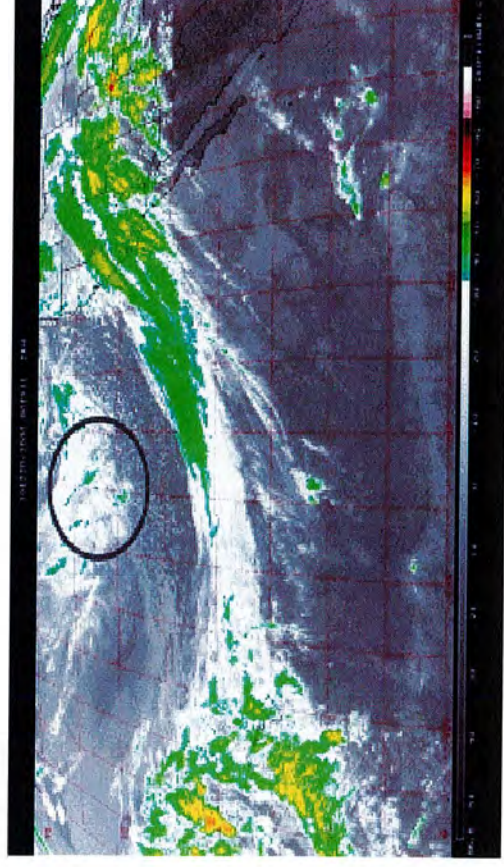

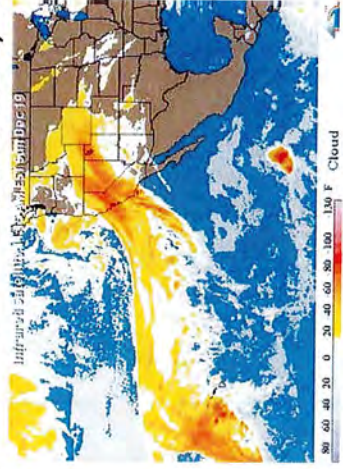

- Response
 - The Mobilization of Emergency Resources
 - Driven by EOP
 - Multiple Agencies/Disciplines
 - Law, Fire, EMS, Public Health, DOT, Public Works, Utilities, Care & Shelter, Logistics, Volunteers, CBO's, Private Sector
 - Must be well coordinated
 - COOP/COG Potential



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Department Operations Center

- The DOC Serves As:
 - the agency coordination centers
 - the point to develop the tactics to implement the policy direction and overall objectives
 - develops recommendation from a responders perspective on operational issues
 - collates situational awareness and transmits the same to the EOC (most important aspect, eyes in the field on what's going on)



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Emergency Operations Center

- Central Incident Coordination Center
- Two EOC's in One (County & Operational Area)
- Policy Level Tool of the Chief Executive
- Collection Point for Situational Awareness
- Primary Local Contact for State & Federal Govt
- Develop Policy and Establish Priorities
- Coordinate Resources
- Coordinate Information Flow
- Coordinate w/ DOC's & ICP's
- Not a Tactical Center



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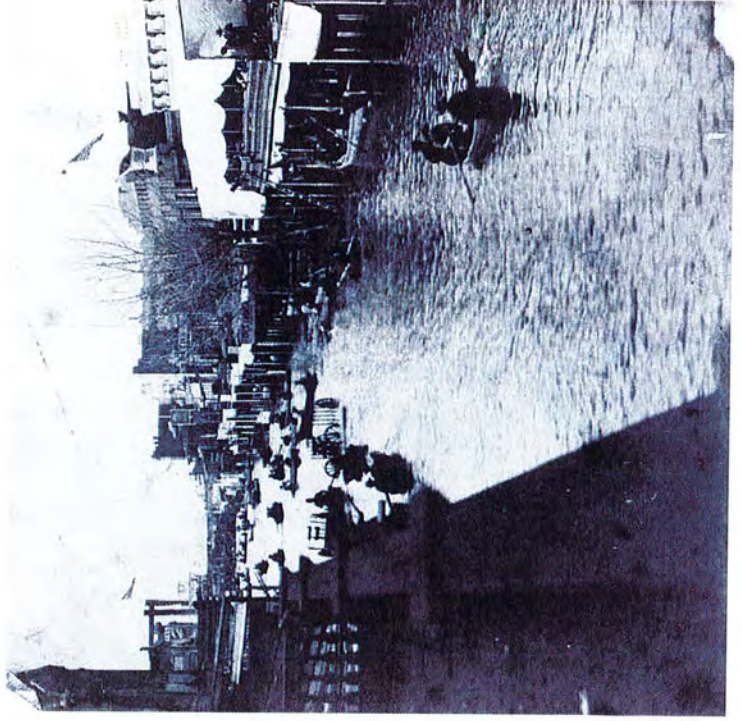

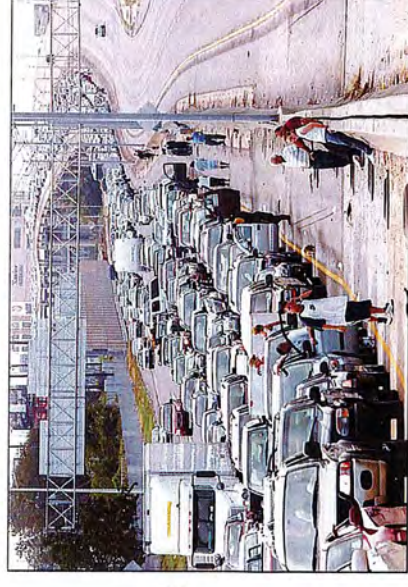

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Emergency Proclamation

- Provides extended liability protection for government workforce
- Allows for waiving of local procurement processes
- Can establish curfews, restrict or deny entry of the general population
- Opens funding or reimbursement from the state or federal government
- Access resources from or through the state or federal government
- Allows for Disaster Service Worker provisions



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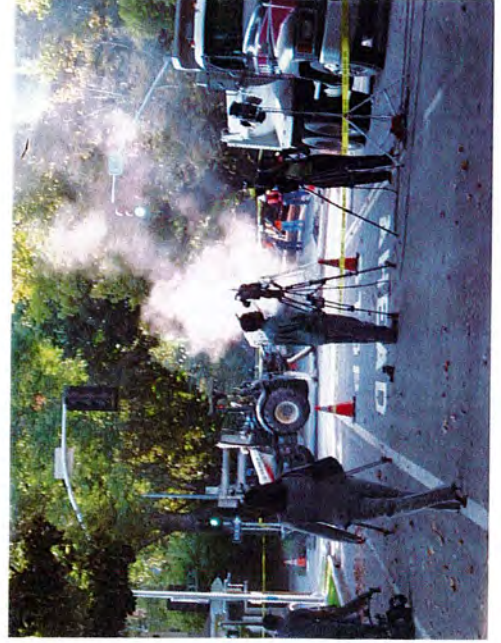
Sacramento County OES

When should you notify Sac OES?

- Ongoing Situational Information Flow is Critical
- When you see that events are extending beyond normal
 - Advise OES to ensure jurisdiction wide situational awareness
 - Need for local government resources (people &/or things)
 - Advise when opening DOC
 - Quicker Information Flow will result in quicker resource support
 - Eyes in the field critical to understanding what is happening
 - OES services may enhance your field operation

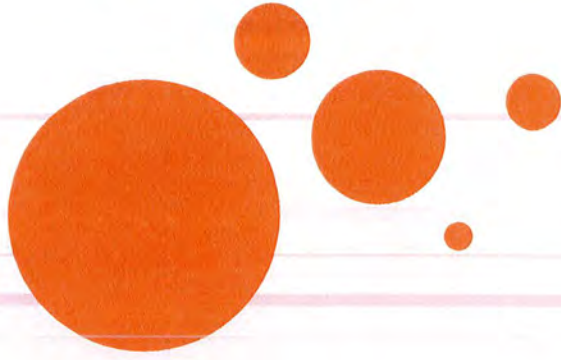

BACKGROUND

California Health and Safety Code §1797.153.

In each operational area the county health officer and the local EMS agency administrator may act jointly as the medical health operational area coordinator (MHOAC).

The MHOAC in cooperation with:

- *OES*
- *public health*
- *environmental health*
- *mental health*
- *EMS agency*
- *fire department*
- *regional disaster and medical health coordinator (RDMHC)*
- *regional office of the Office of Emergency Services (OES)*

shall be responsible for ensuring the development of a medical and health disaster plan for the operational area.

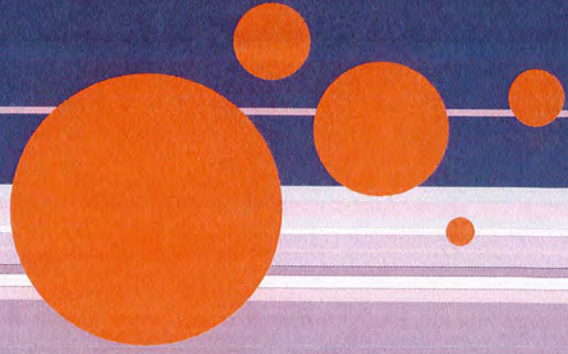


MHOAC 17 FUNCTIONS

1797.153 (c) The medical and health disaster plan shall include preparedness, response, recovery, and mitigation functions ...and, at a minimum, the medical and health disaster plan, policy, and procedures shall include all of the 17 functions.

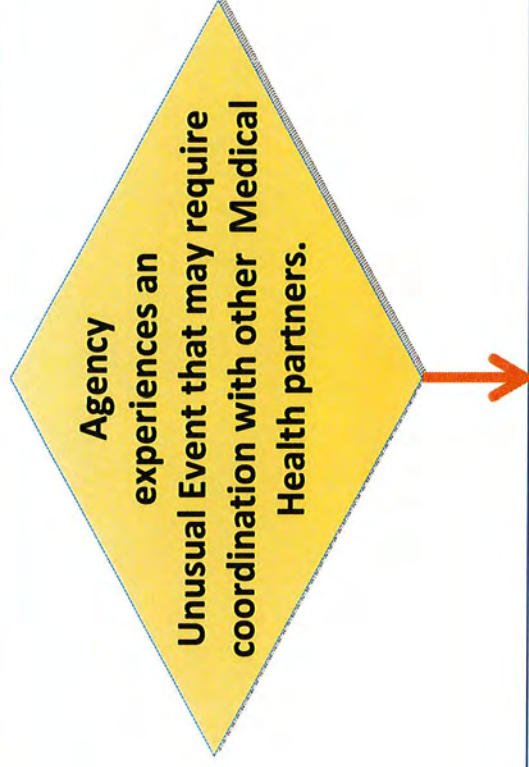

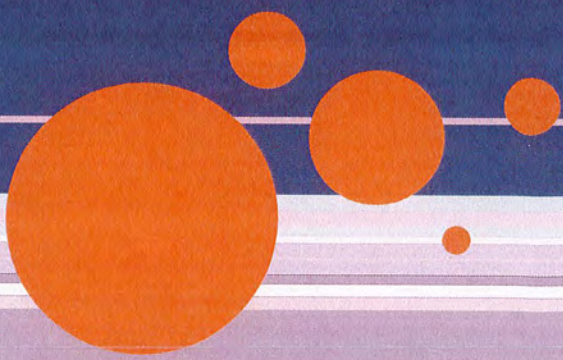

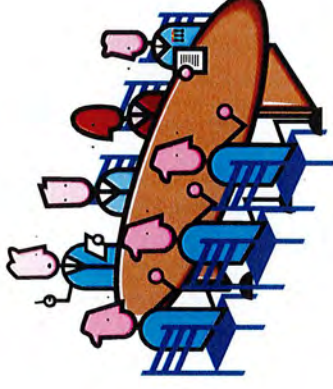

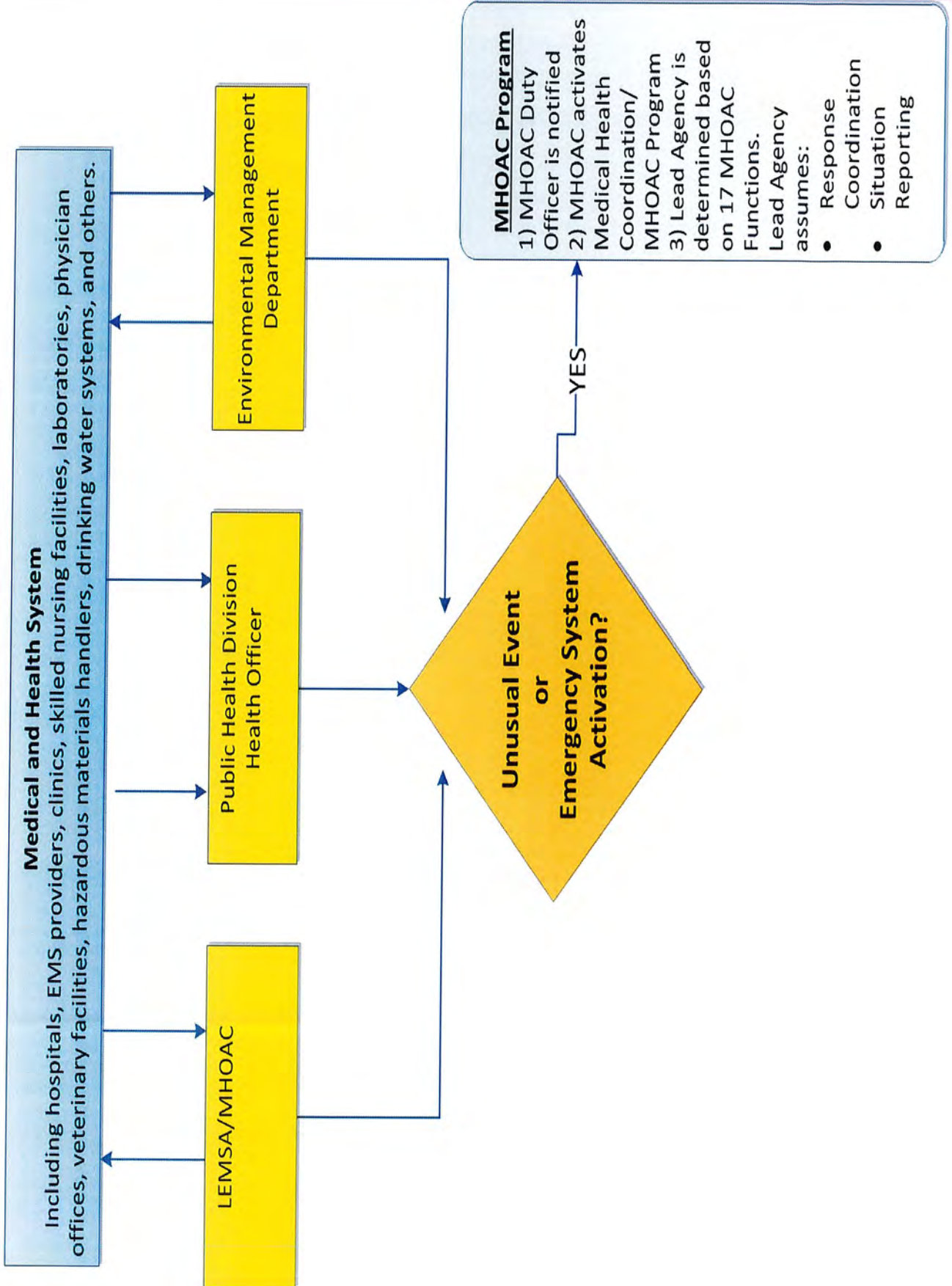
When is the MHOAC a Program?

MHOAC Program Activation



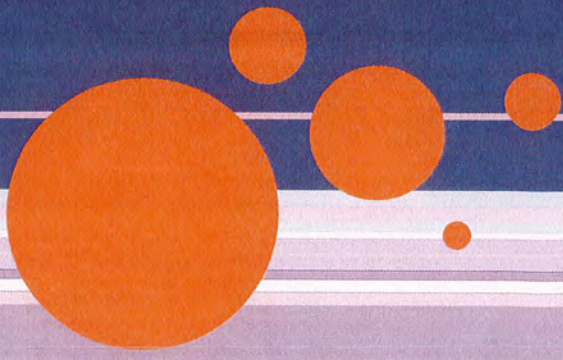

MHOAC 17 FUNCTIONS

Lead Agency

LEMSA

- (1) Assessment of immediate medical needs.
- (2) Coordination of disaster medical and health resources.
- (3) Coordination of patient distribution and medical evaluations.
- (4) Coordination with inpatient and emergency care providers.
- (5) Coordination of out-of-hospital medical care providers.
- (6) Coordination and integration with fire agencies personnel, resources, and emergency fire prehospital medical services.
- (7) Coordination of providers of nonfire based prehospital emergency medical services.
- (8) Coordination of the establishment of temporary field treatment sites.

MHOAC 17 FUNCTIONS

Lead Agency

- (9) Health surveillance and epidemiological analysis of community health status
- (13) Provision of medical and health public information protective action recommendations
- (17) Investigation and control of infectious Diseases

Public Health

MHOAC 17 FUNCTIONS

(10) Assurance of food safety

(11) Management of exposure to hazardous agents

EMD

(12) Provision of coordination of mental health services

Behavioral Health

(14) Provision or coordination of vector control services

(15) Assurance of drinking water safety

Sac. County Dept. of Water Resources

(16) Assurance of the safe management of liquid, solid, and hazardous wastes
