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<p>Primary Health Services Division Update Women, Infants & Children (WIC)</p> <p>Adult Correctional Health</p>	<p>Dr. Farla Kaufman</p> <p>Women, Infants & Children (WIC)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Dr. Damiano apologized for missing her WIC Director's Report. <p>Adult Correctional Health</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• This program is now operating under a Consent Decree. Approved by the Federal court in early January.• Staffing shortage (providers and nursing) is extremely challenging and it is impacting our access as well as initiatives.• Began provision of discharge medication in late December. Initially for sentenced adults with Serious Mental Illness (SMI) and in mid-January to entire sentenced population. This is a complex process and we are still working on overcoming operational challenges. Discharge planning is a multi-step process requiring additional resources. Mental health have been working on linkage to county mental health providers for the SMI population.• Began Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) in late 2019. Providers trained on use of MAT for Alcohol Use Disorder and currently our Medical Director is working on MAT for Opioid Use Disorders. This initiative is focused on continuation medication. The provider shortage is impacting all work.

Medi-Cal Managed Care Advisory Committee

- In addition to monthly updates for Enrollment data, we also posted Enrollment, Enrollment and Net Change (2011-2018), and Enrollment by Plan (2011-2019).
- Medi-Cal Healthier California for All (formerly CalAIM) is a fundamental transformation of Medi-Cal. Last meeting we had members of our committee and local providers who are on the state workgroups provide a panel discussion of the Medi-Cal Healthier California work groups. See our notes. - DHCS January 2020 program roll outs include:
 - ✓ Health Homes Program – Sacramento County implementation for members with Serious Mental Illness (SMI). HHP is a care management program for high cost, high utilizer members. Typically have multiple chronic conditions and/or comorbid behavioral health condition and high use of costly levels of care such as emergency department visits.
 - ✓ Medi-Cal Expansion to Undocumented Young Adults – those meeting criteria who were in restricted scope Medi-Cal automatically transitioned into Medi-Cal Managed Care in January. This was approximately 1,400 members. Any new applicants must apply.
 - ✓ Optional Benefits Restoration – Optometry, podiatry, speech, audiology, and incontinence creams & washes

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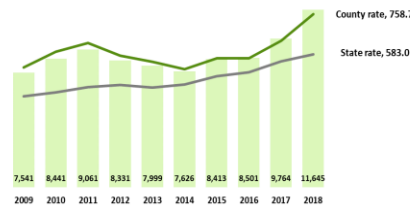

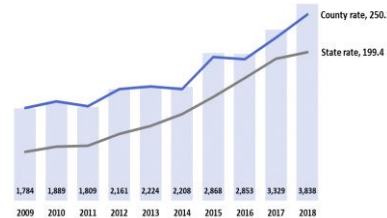
Trend in Chlamydia Cases and Rates, 2009-2018

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Chlamydia and Gonorrhea Rates by Select Race/Ethnicity, 2018

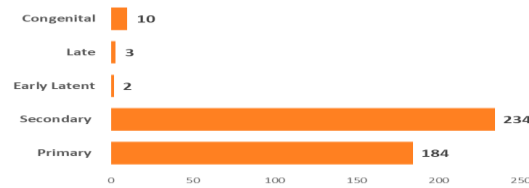

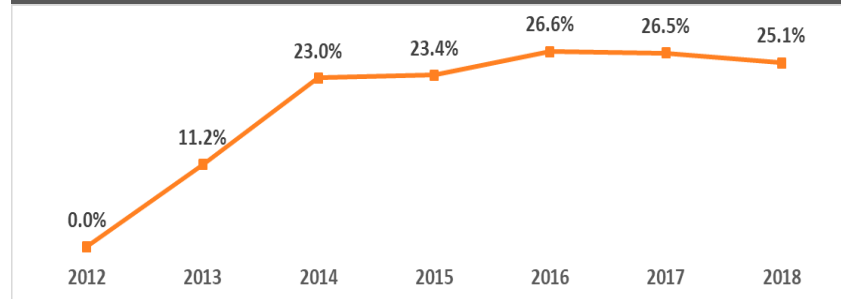
