





Due to system limitations, count of sentenced and pre-sentenced is inaccurate. Inmates are only considered sentenced if all outstanding charges are sentenced and/or there are no holds (i.e. warrants from other counties, MH holds, etc.).

Definitions:

- Length of Stay (LOS) was determined from time of booking until 4/5/2022.
- <u>MH</u> Mental Health
- <u>MH Non-SMI</u> Individuals diagnosed with a MH condition that is not categorized as a MH SMI diagnosis.
- <u>SMI</u> Individuals with a diagnosis of a Schizophrenia Spectrum and Other Psychotic Disorders, Borderline Personality Disorder, PTSD, Major Depressive Disorder, and/or Bipolar and Related Disorders. Data includes patients served in all jail facilities including the Jail Based Competency Treatment (JBCT) program.

MENTAL HEALTH – Received mental health services while incarcerated

- 64% (2,138) received mental health services during incarceration.
- 27% (901) had a Serious Mental Illness (SMI) and 37% (1,237) had a MH Non-SMI diagnosis.



BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES – *in the community*

Of the **2,138** inmates who received mental health services during their incarceration, only a small number were open to a behavioral health provider in the community on April 5, 2022. Most were closed to services.

963 unduplicated inmates were served by Behavioral Health programs:
