# **Opioid/Fentanyl Education and Awareness**

2023- 22 deaths between Jan-March 2022- 150 deaths up from 2021 2021- 116 deaths

## Fentanyl Education and Awareness in Schools/Colleges:

- Continues in Middle and High Schools across Sac County of Sacramento
- Plan to increase education and awareness on college campuses
- 2023 Jan through May 44 schools, 12 school districts, 60 presentations, 36,000 impacted

#### Narcan Distribution:

- Continues in public facing lobbies, Community Based Organizations, County programs, community requests, parents at school meetings
- 3/29/23, the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) approved the first nonprescription, "over-the-counter" (OTC) naloxone nasal spray, Narcan.
- Fentanyl test strips available through County and DHCS State Opioid Response (SOR) contractors can purchase (CORE).

- Gone Too Soon Memorial Poster Project:

# **OD Map Update:**

- Between January 1, 2023 to May 29, 2023 there were 1,239 reported ODs, 6 of which were fatal. Naloxone was administered in 658 of these reported ODs (53%). Reported ODs have been increasing since February of this year. Synthetic Marijuana reported OD's this month.

## **Stimulant Education and Awareness**

- Meth Data: 2022- 214 Meth related deaths; 2021- 205 Meth related deaths
- Meth Coalition: Next meeting Aug 10, 2-4 pm. www.Let'sTalkMeth.org
- <u>Cocaine</u> on the rise. Increased ED visits in multiple emergency departments due to fentanyl laced cocaine overdoses in May 2023

# Xylazine "Tranq" Update

- Horse Tranquilizer with pain killing and muscle relaxant properties
- Added to fentanyl, heroine, cocaine and meth, not approved for human use
- Leading to increased OD deaths, 10 Sacramento xylazine/fentanyl involved deaths in 2022, SUPT watching this closely. Trainings provided upon request; Flyer created

# **SUD Treatment Expansion**

- SUD Residential Treatment Infrastructure RFP concluded
- Capacity Expansion: 2 providers selected: Sacramento Recovery House and HealthRIGHT 360
- Approval by BOS in May. Both providers in process of securing locations
- Approx. 112 new residential beds
- Sac Recovery awarded DHCS Grant for MAT in Residential Treatment partnership between Sac Recovery House and CORE Medical Clinic
- Transitions Clinic DMC certified (Suboxone) and in County contracting process

## **SUD Services for Senior and Older Adults**

SUPT attending meetings and collaborating on care coordination (Older Adult Coalition, Adult Protective Services MDT, Aging Resource Exchange, Adult and Aging Commission, Aging Resource Directory)

#### SUPT added to

#### Coroner Data 2021

- 116 deaths from fentanyl, 17% age 55+
- 205 deaths from meth, 52% age 55+

## Coroner Data 2022 (Jan-April 2022)

- 25 deaths from fentanyl, 2% age 55+
- 36 deaths from meth, 47% age 55+

#### Sac County Data FY 21/22

- Ages 55-59, 547 admits, heroine (30%), alcohol (23%), meth (21%)
- Ages 60+, 717 admits, heroine, other and alcohol

## **Opioid Remediation Funding**

- DHS leadership in discussion on how to use funding for FY 2022/23, FY 23/24
- BOS approval to accept the funds and plans for expenditure 3/28, approved May 9
- SUPT currently considering proposals
- Stakeholder engagement and feedback process in progress. Survey to also go out to community first week of June (survey and hard copy). LOI and RFA to go out in Mid-June
