


**PHAB REPORT:
Adult Correctional Health Updates**


Nurse Intake



- **In FY 2022/23 YTD, ACH completed an average of 2,337 Nurse Intakes per month.**
 - 2,012 intakes were completed in June – a decrease of 44 from May.
- **Beginning the week of May 7, 2023, ACH launched the Two-Tier Intake pilot rollout.**
 - 2,878 receiving screenings were completed in June – an increase of 659 from May.
 - The goal of the rollout was to design and pilot a successful, efficient two-tier medical screening process that ensures timely access to services while preventing unnecessary wait times for arresting agencies.
- Approximately **33%** of the intakes each month involved individuals meeting the definition of homelessness. The Intake RN must mark “housed” or “homeless”.


Homeless Definition: Living in a place not meant for human habitation (street, car, river, camp, etc.), shelter, transitional housing, or exiting other institutions where they temporarily resided (less than 90 days).

Jail Facilities Average Daily Population (ADP)



- The highest ADP was pre-pandemic in September 2019 (3,751) and the lowest ADP (2,418) was May 2020.
- The ADP in May 2023 is 2,982.

Mental Health Population



- **70% (2045)** of the population had a MH diagnosis and received Mental Health services during incarceration.
- **33% (962)** had a Serious Mental Illness (SMI) and **37% (1083)** had a MH Non-SMI diagnosis.


- Of the **2,045** patients who held a Mental Health diagnosis and received Mental Health services during their incarceration, **962 (47%)** were considered SMI. Only a small number were open in a Behavioral Health Services program in the community on April 3, 2023 – most were discharged from services at the time of this report.
- Of the **962** patients with SMI, **555 (58%)** were previously open to Behavioral Health Services Mental Health Plan and **94 (10%)** were currently still open.


Chronic Physical Health Conditions

- The Daily Population when data was pulled for this report on June 28, 2023 = 3,267



- 35% of the population have chronic physical health conditions.

- Of those with chronic physical health conditions, **42%** have two or more conditions.
- Of those with a chronic physical health condition (1,145):
 - **58% (665)** have only one chronic physical health condition.
 - **24% (275)** have two chronic physical health conditions.

- With 23-24FY Board approved growth and reallocation:
 - Total allocated County Medical and Administrative FTEs increased from 239.5 to 251.5.
 - The vacancy rate increased from 23% in June to 26% in July.

- With 23-24FY Board approved growth and reallocation:
 - Total allocated ACMH FTEs increased from 106.9 to 129.9.
 - The vacancy rate increased from 19% in June to 31.4% in July.

Consent Decree Population Reduction Efforts and Jail Facility Needs

- IHSF: Sacramento County has begun meetings to discuss planning for the Main Jail Intake and Health Services Facility (IHSF) to address physical plant deficiencies that impede Consent Decree compliance – including compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), patient privacy, and sufficient space for medical and mental health services.
- BOS Meeting dated [12/08/2022](#), deliberations on recommendations presented 12/07/22 regarding Jail Population Reduction Plans and Plans to address Jail Facility Deficiencies for the Mays Consent Decree resulted in their approval. An update on implementation of the Jail Population Reduction Plans (15 New Recommendations, 18 Existing, 33 Total Strategies) will be provided to the BOS quarterly.
