NorCal Resist Presentation

- NorCal Resist's California Rapid Response Network provides training for immigrants on their rights and needs.
- Data indicates that most detained immigrants are the primary earners for their families. In the event of immigration raids, NorCal Resist supports impacted families by offering food and other essential assistance.
- Many immigrant communities are withdrawing from Medi-Cal services due to fears of being targeted for accessing state-funded programs. Additionally, immigrant families are experiencing significant mental distress caused by current immigration policies. To help them cope, NorCal Resist has established mental health support groups and after-school programs for the children of immigrant communities.

Sacramento County Primary Care Clinic Services

- The Sacramento County Primary Care Clinic is a designated Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC). The board is composed of 51% patients and 49% community members, ensuring a balanced representation.
- The clinic offers a variety of services, including adult care, pediatric care, family medicine, and a specialized refugee health clinic. Additionally, it provides primary care services to foster children and supports the unhoused population through mobile outreach, a medical mobile team, and collaboration with Loaves and Fishes.

Public Health Updates

- The federal funding for the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), which supports nutritional education in schools for families receiving SNAP benefits, will end at the end of September. The County is working with the Department of Personnel Services to find alternative assignments for impacted staff. Additionally, there will be budget cuts to the emergency preparedness and hospital preparedness programs.
- The Governor announced the creation of the Western Health Alliance, which includes Washington and Oregon. The alliance will provide vaccine recommendations for Western States.

Primary Care Updates

 Adult Correctional is collaborating with a consultant to evaluate the delivery of medical services in correctional facilities. The goal is to determine if there is a need for an intake health service facility at the main jail and the Rio Cosumnes Correctional Center.

• Sacramento EMS Grant

- Sacramento EMS received a grant from the state to establish a buprenorphine and Medication-Assisted Treatment (MAT) program for Sacramento County residents. The grant will help create a buprenorphine hotline.
- Individuals who call the hotline will be able to enroll in treatment programs. They will receive a clinic appointment and be assigned a substance use navigator within 24 hours. Additionally, they will be provided with a prescription for suboxone within 24 hours, as well as up to 90 days of treatment while they wait to be connected to local resources.
- The program will be based at the SANE clinic. Sacramento EMS is partnering with the California Bridge Association to develop a low-barrier bridge clinic network, helping individuals access treatment programs.
