- **Department of Healthcare Services Presentation**

- The HR.1 bill, by Congress will negatively impact the Department of Health Services. There will be reduced access to healthcare, reproductive care, food access, and funding to public health programs and nutrition education programs.
- The programs include Medicaid, CalFresh, Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Programs (SNAP), immunization programs, programs to address health disparities, and epidemiological and lab capacity programs.
- The Department of Health Services (DHS) Programs
 1. Sacramento Safety Net Alliance Workgroups – The workgroups focus on healthcare, food security, and work requirements. These workgroups partner with impacted organizations, as well as those providing support in the three areas, to help mitigate the impact of federal cuts on the community for individuals affected by the elimination of programs and services.
 2. The Behavioral Health Services Act (BHSA) – This will take effect on July 1, 2026. The BHSA redirects funding for prevention services that include suicide prevention and youth programs to the Department of Public Health Programs.
 3. BH Connect – This federal funding reimburses institutions for mental disease (IMD) such as acute and sub-acute treatment facilities.
 4. BH Youth Facility/Psychiatric Rehabilitation Facility (PRF) – This facility is off the Bradshaw Branch Center. It will provide crisis response and youth services.
 5. Adult Correctional Health and Mays Consent Decree – The Department of Health Services continues to implement changes to Correctional Health Services in accordance with the Mays Consent Decree.
 6. Sacramento Health Connect / Social Health Information Exchange (SHIE) – The purpose of this program is to improve care coordination across sectors by sharing primary care data, behavioral health, substance use, mental health, housing data, and criminal justice data to address an individual's needs through a whole-person care approach. Patients have the option to consent or to decline having their health data shared in SHIE.
