**Subject:** Critical Amiodarone Shortage – ALS Transporting Units

Due to the critical shortage of Amiodarone that some agencies are experiencing, SCEMSA is issuing a Critical Amiodarone Shortage guidelines for the use of Lidocaine if you are unable to procure Amiodarone. Lidocaine may be used where Amiodarone is considered for Adult Cardiac Dysrhythmias (PD# 8024) Non-Traumatic Cardiac Arrest (PD# 8031) and Pediatric Medical Cardiac Arrest (PD# 9006). Use of Lidocaine must meet the same criteria for use of Amiodarone by SCEMSA policies.

\*\*During the shortage, SCEMSA will not require Non-Transporting ALS Units to stock amiodarone or lidocaine.

## Requirement for use of Lidocaine in place of Amiodarone:

Monitor and report to SCEMSA every use of Lidocaine.

### **Guideline for use of Lidocaine:**

Cardiac Arrest from Ventricular Tachycardia (VT) or Ventricular Fibrillation (VF)

- Initial dose: 1 mg/kg IV/IO.
- For refractory VF may give additional 1 mg/kg IV push, repeat in 5 to 10 minutes; maximum 3 doses or total of 3 mg/kg.

## **Perfusing Arrhythmia:**

For stable VT, wide complex tachycardia of uncertain type

- Initial dose 1 mg/kg.
- May repeat 0.5 mg/kg every 5-10 minutes with maximum total dose of 3 mg/kg.

#### Lidocaine Shortage:
