Subject: New Process for MICN Programs

Effective immediately, all base hospitals will be responsible for conducting and teaching their own MICN programs. This new process aims to standardize the training procedures and ensure that all nurses receive consistent and comprehensive education directly from their respective institutions.

Key Points to Note:

1. Curriculum and Resources: SCEMSA will provide each base hospital with a standardized curriculum required to effectively run the MICN program.
2. Support and Coordination: SCEMSA will remain available to assist with any questions or concerns during this transition.

SCEMSA believes this new approach will enhance the quality of training provided to all MICNs, ensuring they are well-equipped to handle the demands of their roles.
