# Protect Your Preteen/Teen with Vaccines

Protect them from serious diseases including HPV cancers, meningitis, tetanus, whooping cough, flu, and COVID-19.



#### **AGES 9 - 10**

- HPV dose 1 (human papillomavirus)
- · HPV dose 2 (6 12 months after dose 1)

#### **AGES 11 - 12**

- Meningitis dose 1 (MenACWY)
- Tdap (tetanus, diphtheria, whooping cough)
- · HPV (if 2 doses haven't been given)

#### **AGE 16**

- Meningitis dose 2 (MenACWY)
- · Meningitis B series (MenB)

#### YEARLY

Flu (seasonal influenza)

Preteens and teens should stay up to date with COVID-19 vaccine to help protect them from COVID-19.
