MEASLES

Measles is a highly contagious viral illness. As of May 23, 2024, 142 cases of Measles have been identified in the United States. The California Department of Public Health (CDPH) Health Alert from 3/14/2024 urges California Healthcare Providers to immediately isolate suspected individuals and contact their local health department.

Trained staff will aid in rapid identification and isolation of individuals with suspected measles. This important step will help prevent transmission and decrease exposure risk.

SCHOOL REQUIREMENT TO INFORM FAMILIES ABOUT HPV VACCINE (ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 659)

As of January 1, 2024, the <u>Cancer Prevention Act - Assembly Bill No.</u> 659, requires schools to notify 6th grade parents or legal guardians about recommendations for human papillomavirus vaccine (HPV). HPV causes certain cancers and other transmissible infections.

It is important to strongly recommend HPV vaccine to all students ages 9 years and older. The California Department of Public Health (CDPH) has created a <u>template</u> that schools may choose to use.

ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON IMMUNIZATION PRACTICES (ACIP)

ACIP is a group of qualified physicians who develop recommendations on immunization practices to reduce morbidity and mortality of vaccine preventable diseases.

The committee meets three times per year and additionally will reconvene if emergent recommendations are needed. The latest (ACIP) updates can be found here.

Vaccine Tips

April 2024

Ensure patient safety and proper reporting of immunization administration errors and adverse events!



- After a vaccine has been administered, report any adverse vaccine events (e.g., negative reactions or serious side effects) to <u>Vaccine Adverse Effects Reporting</u> <u>System</u> (VAERS).
- For any preventable vaccine administration errors (e.g., wrong administration site or incorrect or expired dose), report to <u>Vaccine Error Reporting Program</u> (VERP).
- Report nirsevimab (Beyfortus) adverse events and immunization errors to the FDA using MedWatch.
- Review this job aid for details on when to use VAERS, VERP, and MedWatch.
