Hello –

At last the wait is over. Please see the new Community Health Worker and Enhanced Community Health Worker Services Policy as well as the update Staff Registration and Credentialing Policy.

The following updates have been made to the Staff Registration Forms:

Attachment A – MHP

1. Added AOD Counselor as now they are allowed to bill under Mental Health Plan programs as long as they continue to provide services within their scope of practice.
2. Added CHW as a new classification available to MHP services.

Attachment A1 – SUPT

1. Added Other Qualified Provider (OQP) as they are now allowed to provide services under the Sacramento County SUPT providers as long they are providing service within their scope of practice .
2. Add CHW as a new classification available to MHP services.

The Procedure Code Manuals are in the process of being updated to include the new classifications and code sets as well as adding the procedure codes for the EBP bulk rates which will be implemented as the Centers of Excellence come on line for training and fidelity reviews.

I would also like to request that the Staff Registration Forms and accompanying attachments are filled out completely. Going forward this information will be the primary method of gathering data for Sacramento County BHS's network adequacy submissions, so current and complete information is key to keep us in compliance.
