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	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Board of Supervisors have requested three program proposals based on the community feedback: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ 8hrs a day 7 Days a week ○ 16hrs a day 7 Days a week ○ 24hrs a day 7 days a week • All three program would be based on a program called “Crisis Now” which is a Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) supported, nationally recognized evidence based program. • Tight timeline for program development. • On March 29, 2021, a presentation will be provided to the Board of Supervisors. Proposal in state budget for \$750 million continuum of behavioral health care. State may require at 25% county match. More information will follow as it becomes available.
