Welcomes/Roll Call	County staff conducted roll call and a quorum of Advisory Board members was confirmed. Chair, Melinda Avey, called the meeting to order at 5:11 pm.
Review Fiscal Year (FY) 2021-22 Budget in Brief	Lori Miller, Substance Use Prevention and Treatment Services Division Manager, shared and discussed the <i>Sacramento County Fiscal Year 2021-22 Budget in Brief</i> with meeting attendees.
Review and Discussion of Survey Monkey Results	In June, the Board of Supervisors approved a Community Engagement Plan for the FY 2022-23 budget. The FY 2022-23 budget process is designed to increase transparency and to provide an opportunity for public input, as well as have a more robust public engagement process. Sacramento County is seeking input from the County's advisory boards and commissions in order to identify community needs and help determine budget priorities. On August 27, 2021 and August 30, 2021, emails were sent to all Advisory Board members requesting them to complete

	Lori Miller shared the top five budget priorities of each Advisory Board member who completed the survey while also maintaining confidentiality of Advisory Board members.
	Meeting attendees participated in a robust discussion with each Advisory Board member sharing their FY 2022-23 budget priorities. Chair Avey also solicited input from County staff. Upon conclusion of the discussion, Advisory Board members identified the following five budget priorities for FY 2022-23:
	 Increased Residential Capacity for Men, Co-Occurring, Adults, and Youth Increased Detox Capacity/Community Sobering Services Increased Sober Living Environments/Recovery Housing Funding and Capacity Permanent Supportive Housing / Case Management Services: Adults, Seniors Pre-trial Programs/Alternatives to Incarceration Chris Carlson made a motion to approve the five budget priorities listed above and Jennifer Churchill second the motion.
