Who is the HYTF- Shelly

- Youth-serving organizations in the entire homelessness continuum (housing, mental health, supportive services, workforce)
- Learned to collaborate vs. compete.
- "Official" mental health respite services providers (WYS & LGBT Center)
 - Every service provider providing MHS is some fashion
 - One time funds, such as PEI, cripple service provision while on-going funds like Respite help to maintain staff, make PD available, build trust with youth
 - When funds are made available, (e.g. 8%) minimal amount is for youth programs

System Gaps-Shelly

- Low youth inventory:
 - YHN/The Stay
 - Co-occurring substance use disorder/mental health remediation
- Housing opportunities not connected to MH services:
 - Room & board
 - Vouchers
 - PSH

Crisis-response

- Alternatives to policing for 51/50 calls by providers
- "Adulting" impacts housing retention
 - Accountability/trauma-induction

Opportunities- Robynne

- Professional development
 - High quality behavioral health trauma therapy
 - Career pathways-fretention/turnover

- Clinical Supervision
 - Provider network to provide support
 - "Golden ticket" into treatment centers
- YHN as a model
 - Outreach
 - Easy engagement





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
